MEMORIAL ALCOVE-Chris has reserved the area used last year for the water ceremony, next to the Still Living Room. The area is about half as deep as it was and this alcove can be used for our memorial banners and meditations. The memorial kiosk will still be out where it was last year.

MOTION REQUEST-Per Jim's request in his absence, Alan brought forward a possible motion for our consideration.
