

## Oregon Country Fair Site Usage and Rental

The Oregon Country Fair site is available to use as a venue space during the Fair's off-season. It is not available May 1 – August 30. The site is broken up into various zones, each of which have their own permits specifying their use.

While the site is available to use, this does not include any of our facilities, including, but not limited to, Main Camp kitchen, screen kitchen, or port-a-potties. Event organizers are required to provide any necessary accommodations for their attendees, including port-a-potties, seating, stage equipment, and signage. No equipment will be provided by the Fair.

### Fees

- OCF work parties and committee meetings are excluded from having to pay usage fees and deposits
- \$500 refundable deposit (**if site is restored to original condition**)
- \$500 for day-use only
- \$1000 per night for overnight stays

The following areas are available for use:

### Main Stage

- **Only available April 1 – April 30 and September 1 – October 31**
- Social gatherings of single-day events are allowed here (weddings, picnics, memorials, etc)
- Overnight events will typically occur on a Saturday with participants arriving on Friday and leaving on Sunday
- Maximum of 500 persons allowed
- Music is limited from 3pm – 10pm
- Maximum of 2 events per year

### Alice's

- Available year-round **except for May 1 – August 30**
- Available for park and campground use (day camps, retreats, environmental education, etc)
- Camping is allowed here
- Maximum of 100 persons allowed
- Music is limited from 3pm – 10pm
- Maximum of 23 events per year

### Dragon Plaza, Xavanadu, Miss Piggy's

- Available year-round **except for May 1 – August 30**
- Day-use only
- Social gatherings such as weddings, concerts, reunions, etc are not authorized in this area
- Activities in this area must be primarily recreational or primarily dependent upon or associated with the forest/natural nature of the area
- Maximum of 500 persons allowed
- Maximum of 4 events per year
- No campfires allowed
